"CALLING YOUNG ADULTS"

Young adults between the ages of 17 and 24 who are <u>not</u> attending high school or college and not returning to school are a priority for Job Service North Dakota. This focus includes GED students.

We have Workforce Innovation Opportunity Act (WIOA) program funds to assist eligible out-of-school youth with employment opportunities.

Out–of –school youth are those who have dropped out of high school; graduated from high school or college; or are attending GED classes and are 17-24 years old.

Activities include paid work experience up to 25 hours a week, onthe-job training for fulltime positions and apprenticeship. WIOA funds can pay from 50 to 100% of wages for up to six months so there may be an incentive for businesses to hire young people.

Eligibility is the first step. If you know out-of-school youth between the ages of 17 to 24 that are interested in these opportunities, they can call our office to visit with a WIOA staff representative. Did you know?

IN DEMAND OCCUPATIONS FOR NORTH DAKOTA

The Governor's Workforce Development Council has established an in-demand occupations list for North Dakota in accordance with the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA). The list includes occupations determined to have a current or potential impact on the state's economy. North Dakota Labor Market Information's 2014-2016 short-term employment projections were used by applying the following factors: exceptional or high growth, replacement openings, aggregate average hourly entry wages, growth openings, and required educational levels.
